

PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND

The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) requires early and continuous public participation in the development and amendment of comprehensive land use plans and development regulations that implement the comprehensive plan (RCW 36.70A.140). Additionally, the GMA requires local jurisdictions to notify the State of such an amendment at least sixty days before its adoption (RCW 36.70A.106). King County Code 20.18.150 provides the basis for the County's public participation program for such amendments, and requires that the County also notify the public of such amendments at the same time that the State is given notice. As outlined below, King County intends to amend a development regulation. Notice to the State has been given and, therefore, this document is providing notice to the public.

In November 2024, Public Health – Seattle & King County intends to forward the following proposed amendments to King County Board of Health Code to the King County Board of Health for consideration and possible adoption:

A proposed revision to King County Board of Health Title 13 Onsite Sewage Code, related to rules and regulations (R&R) overseeing on-site sewage systems (OSS) referred to as the "OSS code" (originally adopted by King County Board of Health Rule and Regulation No. 3, December 19, 1986, most recently amended under Rule & Regulation No. 08-03, June 19, 2008)

The On-site Sewage System Program, Public Health – Seattle & King County is accepting public comments on a draft of this proposal through **Tuesday, October 10, 2024**.
