CSHCN - Public Health Nurse Referral - Information

This community service supports children (Birth to 18) and families in the transition from hospital/clinic to home. Public Health Nurses (PHNs) facilitate services as families progress through the continuum of care. **This service is provided regardless of income. There is no charge to the family for PHN services.** PHNs and home health care nurses have different roles, so it is very appropriate to refer to both. The home health care nurse focuses primarily on the child and provides care for the specific condition. The PHN focuses assisting families with information, support and connecting with resources that address the child's special needs. The PHN will contact the family, complete a nursing assessment and define with the family the services the PHN can provide. Services may be provided in the home, clinic or by phone.

Reasons For CSHCN Public Health Nurse (PHN) Referrals

Child has complex health needs and the family needs help with:

- finding or coordinating medical providers
- accessing local resources and/or services for their child
- finding financial assistance for their child's health-related needs
- understanding and/or coping with child's health condition

NOTE: If you suspect child neglect or abuse, you should make a referral to Child Protective Services (CPS). *It is not appropriate to make a PHN referral to assess abuse when that possibility has already been identified.* It is appropriate to also make a PHN referral on these children, with a note that CPS referral has been made; the PHN will make every effort to coordinate with the CPS caseworker.

Referral Information That Should Be Included

- Child's name, birthdate, gender and race/ethnicity
- Address and phone numbers- this should be the address of the place where the family resides (not a P.O. Box #);
- Names and birthdates of both parents, if available
- List primary language of the child and the parent if other than English
- List the community physician or health care practitioner who provides the child's primary care in the community.
- Note if child is involved in a specialty clinic or service and *include date of next appt if known*.
- Explain why the referral is being made; what do you expect the PHN to accomplish?
- List who to contact regarding follow-up. Should information go to a specific clinic or program at a hospital, the community health care provider, or a specific person? Put the title of that person and name of program (e.g., Jane Doe, Clinical Nurse Specialist, Pulmonary) to assist in the communication process.
- If teaching is to be completed, evaluated or reinforced, include what specific information you want assessed and where to send the information from the PHN evaluation.
- If a home environmental assessment is to be completed, include what specific information you want assessed and where to send the information from the PHN evaluation.
- For infants/children being discharged from the hospital: include discharge summary/notes, discharge instructions for parents and relevant chart notes (ie: OT, PT, SLP, SW, specialist & surgeries).
