ALS Subcommittee Report for the 5/16/24 Finance Subcommittee (Endorsed at 5/8/24 ALS meeting)

Accomplishments to Date:

- Members were oriented to issues to be considered by the Subcommittee and endorsed items to be reviewed as part of the Work Plan.
- Reviewed in depth the standard medic unit allocation, including its history, main components, key drivers, and issues experienced.
- Reviewed EMS system trends and specific criteria used to assess ALS service gaps and medic unit needs to anticipate future demand.
- Discussed the benefits and costs of two ALS-specific programs that support the region: <u>ALS</u> <u>Support for BLS Activities</u> and having paramedics train students at Paramedic Training.
- Analyzed actual expenditures for providing ALS services; compared costs and trends across agencies.
- > Reviewed 2026-2031 Status Quo financing proposal.

Decisions made by the Subcommittee:

- 1. To protect the system, include two half-time units as a "placeholder" in the Financial Plan should new units need to be added during the next levy span.
- 2. Financially model the "placeholder" to determine the impact on the 2026-2031 levy Financial Plan.
- 3. Continue conducting the annual medic unit analysis to identify any service gaps and stress on the regional system.
- 4. Sufficiently fund the <u>ALS Support for BLS Activities program</u>; consider enhancing program scope.
- 5. Continue funding to have paramedics train students at Harborview's Paramedic Training program; possibly increase scope.

Next Steps:

- *Determine 2026 preliminary ALS baseline allocations;* inflate over six years.
- *Identify appropriate levels of ALS reserves* and contingencies for the next levy span; determine usage and access requirements.
- *Refine placeholder* costing scenario and incorporate into the Financial Plan.
- Determine scope and budget for <u>ALS Support for BLS Activities</u> and Paramedic Training support.
- *Determine medic unit service* to Skykomish region.
- *Proceed with tasks* as directed by EMS Advisory Task Force at May 22, 2024 meeting.
