

HRSA FY2024-2025 + GRANT OPPORTUNITIES

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Background

- In May 2024, HRSA announced 4 new grant opportunities for fiscal years 2024-2025
- HCHN will apply directly for 3 and will apply in partnership for the 4th funding opportunity:
- FY 2024 Behavioral Health Expansion
- FY 2025 Expanded Hours
- FY 2025 New Access Point
- FY 2025 Transitions in Care for Justice-Involved Populations

Grant details: Behavioral Health Expansion

Up to \$600k Y1, \$500K Y2, ongoing funding pending successful performance. Estimated 400 awards.

Period of performance: Sept 1 2024-Aug 31,2026

Purpose: increase access to behavioral health services through starting or expanding mental health and substance use disorder (SUD) services.

Measured by: Increase in UDS patients receiving MH services; and increase in UDS patients receiving SUD services, including MOUD

Proposal is a partnership with REACH and DESC

*This is the first HRSA grant that explicitly allows funding for contingency management (incentive-based SUD treatment)

HCHN Aligned Priorities

Proposed Budget: \$600,000



REACH: 2 FTE SUD Harm Reduction Specialists and 1 FTE Behavioral Health Specialist



REACH: Supplies and equipment



DESC: \$36,000 to implement contingency management



.25 FTE HCHN contract monitor

Grant details: Expanded Hours

Up to \$500k per year, ongoing funding pending successful performance. Estimated 120 awards.

Period of performance: Dec 1 2024-Nov 30,2026

Purpose: expand access to health center services by increasing health center operating hours to meet identified patient and community needs.

Measured by: Increase in UDS patients and visits, number of sites with increased hours, total hours across all service sites

Proposal: add a half day dental clinic on Saturdays, rotating the care team between 5 PH dental clinic sites: Downtown, Renton, Eastgate, Columbia, and North.

Adds an additional 16 hours per month of dental services across our sites, increasing access to comprehensive dental care and increasing capacity to manage walk-in/emergency visits.

Grant details: New Access Point

Up to \$650k per year, ongoing funding pending successful performance. *Funds have not yet been appropriated for NAP.* Est. 77 new grants.

Period of performance: June 1, 2025-May 21, 2026

Purpose: support new health center service delivery sites

Must begin operations within 120 days of notice of award. Site must operate 40 hrs per week. \$150k max capital funding.

Proposal is a partnership with Consejo Behavioral Health to open a primary care clinic at their Renton site

Focus population is refugees and immigrants who are experiencing homelessness.

Equipment and supplies

Grant details: Transitions in Care for Justice- Involved Populations

Up to \$500k for 2 years, one time funding only. Estimated 51 awards.

Period of performance: Dec 1 2024-Nov 30,2026

Purpose: strengthen transitions in care for individuals who will soon be released from incarceration, increasing their access to community-based, high-quality primary care services.

Required to focus on one or more critical health needs: Managing chronic conditions; HCV, HIV, and other infectious disease; drug overdose; or mental health and substance use disorder treatment.

Seattle Roots (formerly Country Doc) is the primary applicant for this grant. (HCHN staff co-wrote the grant.)

Seattle roots will partner with Public Health Jail Health Services Release Planning Team to provide telehealth visits to individuals at the time of release to continue medications started during their incarceration. Focus on psych and SUD meds.
