### **CALL TO ORDER**

1. Welcome & Introductions

Maria Arns welcomed attendees, including members of the CAG, to the meeting of the HCHN Governance Council (GC). Full quorum present.

2. Minutes

GC members reviewed the minutes from the 4/21 meeting. Amanda Richer made motion to approve the minutes, Gail Emanuel seconded; vote was unanimous in favor of the motion, with Leslie Enzian and Someireh Amirfaiz abstaining.

# RACIAL EQUITY MOMENTS

Carolyn Malone shared the importance of building skills in verbal/nonverbal communication, to more effectively communicate across cultures.

#### PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

1. HCHN Mobile Medical Program Transition

Chante Stubbs, Mobile Medical Health Services Administrator, shared the history of the mobile medical program, philosophy of care, funding dynamics, and transition to a new street team model. PowerPoint is attached.

Attendees asked about continuity of care considerations; Chante said that new weekly rotations are intended to support rapport building and anchor sites are also integrated to ensure continuity of care at select former van sites. Attendees also asked about retraumatizing clients and whether client files are accessible to all staff; Chante said that staff at anchor sites and the Markham Building have internet that allows for EPIC access to check charts. She said the program is also exploring avenues to enhance internet and EPIC access for field teams, including in office support for field staff and advocating for EPIC Haiku (a mobile version of EPIC that gives access to patient charts via a secure app). Attendees asked about access to vision services; Chante said the street team doesn't provide services directly but YWCA has <u>programs</u> to connect clients to eye care. Attendees also asked about wheelchair access; Chante shared that the sprinter vans don't have capacity for wheelchair ramps and instead the team is looking at ways to create private spaces.

2. Lessons from the 2025 National Health Care for the Homeless Council Annual Conference & Policy Symposium

Members who attended the 2025 National Health Care for the Homeless Council (NHCHC) Annual Conference & Policy

Symposium shared learnings and experiences engaging with other programs. They said there were a lot of discussions on federal policy updates, and highlighted the specific session facilitated by Amanda.
