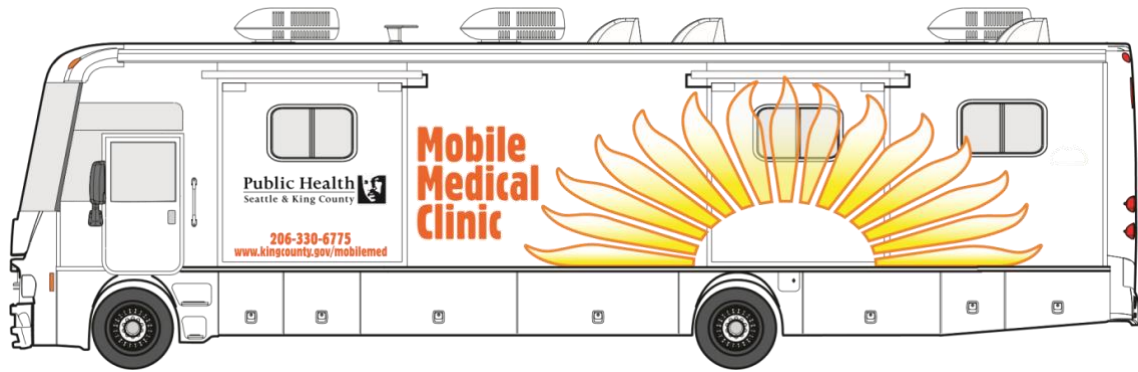
Please note that we take our last medical patients 30 to 60 minutes prior to the clinic end time.

- living in transitional housing?
- Or, have you been homeless in the past year?

If so, the **Mobile Medical Program** is for you!

On-site the mobile medical team offers:

- Doctor and nurse visits for acute and chronic conditions
- STD, HIV and Hepatitis C testing
- Pregnancy tests and birth control
- Access to behavioral health and substance use specialists
- Naloxone overdose prevention training and kits
- Dental care for pain and emergency conditions on select days

We can also help you connect to:

- A doctor’s office that can provide follow-up care
- Mental health counseling
- Substance use counseling via a harm reduction approach
- Enrollment into ORCA Lift transportation assistance
- Referrals to shelter, food, benefits, legal and domestic violence programs

Our mission is to build relationships with people experiencing homelessness by providing patient- centered health and social services, meeting people where they are, and fostering health and well-being.
