

Where to get vaccinated in King County

Vaccines for children

In Washington state, all children ages 0-18 can get routine vaccinations **at no cost** through a healthcare provider that participates in the Childhood Vaccine Program (CVP).

Your child's healthcare provider

You can also use this opportunity to talk about any other health concerns.

School Based Health Centers (SBHCs)

Children who live in a district with an SBHC can access vaccinations during operating hours.

Pharmacies

Most pharmacies accept insurance or charge an out-of-pocket fee.

Mobile clinics

Visit **kingcounty.gov/findaclinic** to see a list of upcoming clinics and to find out if you're eligible.

Vaccines for adults

Check with your healthcare provider or local pharmacy

Most insurance plans cover vaccines recommended for adults, including Medicaid (Apple Health) and Medicare. For Medicare, contact your plan to find out which vaccines are covered.

For uninsured adults ages 19 and older

Some providers offer vaccines at no cost to uninsured adults through the Adult Vaccine Program (AVP).

Call your healthcare provider or pharmacy ahead of time to ask about cost, vaccine availability, ages served, and to make an appointment.
