




Suicide deaths by health reporting areas King County, 2008-2012 average










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


Homicide deaths by health reporting areas King County, 2008-2012 average




















Unintentional injury deaths by health reporting areas King County, 2008-2012 average







Unintentional injury hospitalizations by comparison areas




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
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


Poisoning deaths by health reporting areas King County, 2008-2012 average













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
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


Motor vehicle deaths by health reporting areas King County, 2008-2012 average





Motor vehicle injury hospitalizations by comparison areas










Fall deaths by health reporting areas King County, 2008-2012 average








Fall hospitalizations by comparison areas
