

# BCCHP Abnormal Breast Findings Decision Guide



## Step 1: Do I Fill Out the Abnormal Breast Findings Section?

Yes

I connected with provider who verified finding is **suspicious**

- ✓ Follow up to ensure the correct referral is sent for:
  - Diagnostic mammogram
  - Breast Ultrasound

No

I connected with provider who verified finding is likely **benign**

- ✓ Provider wants verification
- ✓ Mark for diagnostic mammogram only

## Step 2: Is the Client Under 40 Years Old?

Yes

(Client is **under 40**)

- Client must have a Breast exam (CBE) for program to pay for diagnostic follow-up
  - ✓ Must be verified by provider
  - ✓ Refer for diagnostic mammogram and Ultrasound
  - ✓ If client under 35, must verify with SKCPH coverage (need office dictation)

No

(Client is **40 or older**)

- If client had a CBE with suspicious outcome, refer within 60 days for:
  - ✓ Combo diagnostic mammogram and ultrasound
- If CBE shows suspicious signs (e.g., discharge, palpable mass, skin changes, dimpling):
  - ✓ Must be verified by provider
  - ✓ Refer for diagnostic mammogram and ultrasound

## Step 3: Family History Criteria

“First degree relative” includes:

- Mother, sister, brother
- Dad, daughter, son
- Not grandma or cousin

Remember: BCCHP does NOT cover treatment of Mastitis
