A. Borges, OAC	Follow up items	 OAC administrative staff will work with finance staff and PAO to follow up via email detailing requirement to spend funding on Approved Opioid Remediation Uses. (Complete) OAC administrative staff and PAO support will determine potential next steps for remedial actions for jurisdictions that report non-Opioid Remediation expenditures. 		PAO advised OAC that the only concrete remedial action OAC can legally take would include notifying the Settlement Fund Administrator of the noncompliant expenditure(s) and requesting withholding an amount proportional to the noncompliant expenditure, and/or suspension of direct payments to the offending Party and re-allocation by the OAC. OAC would likely want to meet with the city to determine response first. OAC discussed and approved the following procedures: 1. Meet with the city to discuss relevant context around spending, gather additional information about the expenditure, and understand rationale and how they interpreted the permissible uses 2. OAC deliberates and issues a written notice to the jurisdiction. If OAC determines it was a noncompliant use of funds, OAC will give 120 days' notice that the jurisdiction can return the funds. 3. Jurisdictions may have 120 days to appeal the decision either in writing or during an OAC meeting. OAC will issue a final decision following the appeal, giving the jurisdiction 30 days to return funds if the use is still deemed noncompliant. 4. If funding use is determined to be noncompliant, OAC will 1) indicate on the data dashboard that spending was not an Approved Use; 2) take remedial action including notifying the Settlement Fund Administrator, requesting
