Voter registration and election information



## Voter registration information

### Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States
- A legal resident of Washington state
- At least 18 years old by election day
  - If you are 16 or 17, you can sign up as a Future Voter and be automatically registered to vote when you qualify
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order
- Not currently serving a sentence of total confinement under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections for a Washington felony conviction
- Not currently incarcerated for a federal or out-of-state felony conviction

### How to register

#### Online

You can register or update your registration online at [VoteWA.gov](http://VoteWA.gov). Make sure you register online by the October 28 deadline for the November 5 General and Special Election.

#### By mail

Download and print a registration form from [kce.wiki/VoterReg](http://kce.wiki/VoterReg) to register or update your registration and mail it to our office by the October 28 deadline for the November 5 General and Special Election.

#### In person

You can register in person through November 5, Election Day, at a vote center. For more information on locations and hours of vote centers, visit [www.kingcounty.gov/elections](http://www.kingcounty.gov/elections).

### Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply update your information online or submit a new registration form by October 28 for the General and Special Election or visit us in person through November 5, Election Day, at one of the vote centers listed on the King County Elections website.

## Ballot information

On Tuesday, November 5, 2024 in King County, Washington, a General and Special Election conducted entirely by mail will be held.

## Replacement ballot

Call King County Elections to obtain a replacement ballot if your original ballot packet is lost, spoiled, or destroyed.

The official logic and accuracy tests will take place at King County Elections on October 10, 2024. The test for accessible voting units will take place at 9 a.m. The test for tabulation equipment will take place at 1 p.m.

The mid-election logic and accuracy test for tabulation equipment will take place on November 4, 2024, 8 a.m.
