

## Public Hospital District No. 2 Proposition No. 1 Levy Lid Lift for Healthcare Services

The Commission of King County Public Hospital District No. 2 (EvergreenHealth) adopted Resolution No. 949-25 concerning the district's regular property tax levy. If approved, this proposition would provide additional operating and capital funds for EvergreenHealth to provide hospital and other healthcare services to its residents and other persons served by Evergreen Health. It authorizes a maximum regular property levy rate for collection in 2026 of 50 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value. The 2026 levy amount will be used for the purpose of computing the limitations for levies in subsequent years. Should this proposition be:
