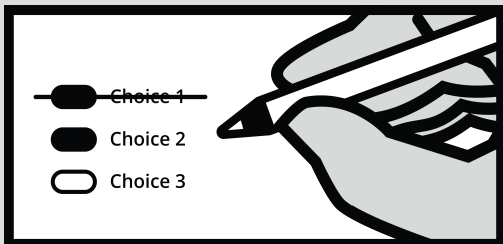

If approved, this proposition would reauthorize funding for the Safe Streets and Sidewalks Improvements and set the maximum total regular levy rate at \$1.65/\$1,000 assessed value in 2026. Improvements include street repairs, potholes and resurfacing; sidewalks, crosswalks and traffic safety infrastructure; and other projects, all as described in the Ordinance. The increased amount levied would carry forward in calculating levy limits for nine years through 2035. Qualifying seniors, veterans, and others would be exempt under State law. This measure increases the City's regular property tax levy not to exceed \$0.95/\$1,000 to a maximum rate not to exceed \$1.90/\$1,000 for 2026; and sets the limit factor for the City's total regular property tax levy for 2027-2031 to 6%.
