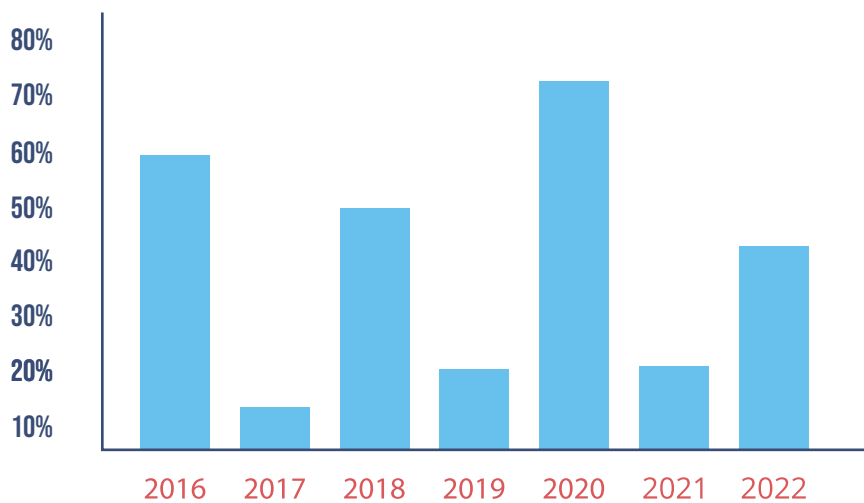

16 and 17 year-olds can pre-register to vote and be automatically registered to vote when they turn 18.

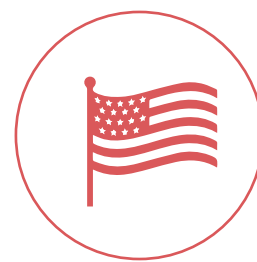
VOTER TURNOUT 18-24 YEAR OLDS IN GENERAL ELECTIONS



HOW DO I QUALIFY? TO BECOME A FUTURE VOTER, YOU MUST BE...



At least 16 years old



A U.S. citizen



A Washington resident

If you start voting when you're young, it becomes a habit. When young people make a habit of voting regularly - in every election large and small - they will hold significant electoral power.

HOW DO I SIGN UP?



You can apply online at VoteWa.gov using your driver's license or state ID.



If you don't have a license, use the last four digits of your social security number and mail a registration form to your county elections office. You can also sign up in-person at your county elections office.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I REGISTER?



A ballot will be mailed to you automatically for the first election in which you're eligible to vote.



You can return your ballot by mail - no stamp needed. Make sure it is postmarked by Election Day.



Or you can drop your ballot in a secure King County Elections drop box until 8 p.m. sharp on Election Day.
