

## No Stamp Needed!

We strongly recommend returning your ballot as early as possible.

Mailed ballots must be postmarked by April 23.

### Your signature matters. Make it match.

Your signature doesn't need to be fancy or even be legible, but it does have to match what's on file. Not sure of what's on file? Check your driver's license or state ID.

Keep your signature current to make sure we can count your ballot. Learn more about your signature and why it matters at kingcounty.gov/elections/signature.

## **Register to vote**



Online: It takes two minutes and a Washington State Driver's License or ID to register online at VoteWA.gov. To register in time to vote in the April Special Election, register online by April 15.



By mail: Download and print a registration form from kce.wiki/VoterReg and mail to King County Elections: 919 SW Grady Way, Renton, WA 98057. It must be received by April 15.



In person: You can register in person through April 23, Election Day at King County Elections headquarters. More information about hours and services can be found at kingcounty.gov/elections.

#### **Vote center**

Open in Renton for this election, the Vote Center is available for those that need assistance. Voters can register to vote and get their ballots at the Vote Center through 8 p.m. on Election Day. We also provide audio or large print ballots and other assistive devices for voters with disabilities.

### Proposition No. 1

# Single-Year Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of East Pierce Fire & Rescue adopted Resolution No. 1046 concerning a proposition to finance maintenance, operations and facilities improvements. Shall the District be authorized to restore the District's regular property tax rate to \$1.50 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, exceeding the 1% limitation on annual increases in tax revenues for one year, with the levy dollar amount collected in 2025 to be used for computing the limitations for subsequent levies?

## **Explanatory statement**

East Pierce Fire & Rescue (District) is placing a one-year lid lift proposition on the April 23, 2024 special-election ballot. East Pierce Fire & Rescue serves a population of over 100,000 residents including Bonney Lake, Sumner, Lake Tapps, the Ridge Communities, South Prairie, Tehaleh, Edgewood, Milton, and a large portion of unincorporated Pierce County. The District responded to 12,558 emergency calls in 2023. This is a 47.4% increase in emergency calls since 2013. However, while firefighters are responding to more calls, the District's \$1.50 general levy has been reduced to \$1.09 due to 1% limitations.

King County Elections is not authorized to edit

statements, nor is it responsible for the contents therein.

Passage of this measure would provide sustainable funding for District operations and emergency response. It will ensure the District can provide the high level of service voters expect, while keeping up with increased service demand and population growth.

If this proposition passes, a taxpayer with the average home value of \$500,000 would anticipate an increased tax of \$17 per month. If approved, this measure authorizes the District to restore the levy rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed property value as previously approved by voters. The dollar amount of the levy collected in 2025 would be used to calculate future levy increase limits.

*Increasing Populations with Limited Resources* 

East Pierce Fire & Rescue serves over 100,000 residents and growing while facing increased demand for fire and medical services. Without approval of Proposition 1, the fire district faces a budget shortfall and *will not* be able to keep up with the growing demand for exceptional lifesaving services.

Not a New Tax

A Yes Vote is not a new tax, but a restoration of the previous voter approved amount of \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value. State law has caused the Fire Levy to drop below the level previously approved by voters in 2017.

Supported by your Firefighters and Commissioners
Supported by your Professional Firefighters and
your Board of Fire Commissioners, this measure
is deemed essential to maintain exceptional
lifesaving services and maintain the improved
services. We urge you to vote Yes on Proposition
1 to restore the fire levy and ensure continued
quality service in our community.
