




#### Record-setting drug bust: Millions of dollars' worth of fentanyl seized from Lynnwood home


The Snohomish Regional Drug Task Force found \$14 million to \$23 million worth of fentanyl. Two people have been arrested.

Investigators said the home operation..., could produce 1.4 million counterfeit pills, enough to kill about 700,000 people. August, 2020

#### **Overdose Mapping – Jan 2020 to Present**











## Outpatient SUD Services

BHRD currently contracts with 23 SUD Outpatient Providers delivering services throughout King County.

- Many offer both MH and SUD outpatient services.
- 4 Providers provide MAT (methadone dosing) as part of their SUD outpatient programming.

#### Access to Outpatient Services

- Must meet ASAM criteria for outpatient or intensive outpatient level of care

#### Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Residential Treatment

- Intensive Inpatient (youth/adult)
- Co-Occurring Disorder Treatment (youth/adult)
- Long-term Care
- Recovery House (youth/ adult)
- Pregnant and Parenting Women (PPW)

#### **Residential Referral Process**





- Referrals can either go through an Outpatient Provider or directly to a Residential Provider
- Residential Provider completes an assessment and requests authorization from King County or MCO (CHPW only)

#### Acute Withdrawal Management


#### Acute Withdrawal Management

- 3 AWM providers, both in and out of King County
- May be referred by outpatient providers, or self-refer
- Available 24/7
- Must meet ASAM criteria
- Will be screened and referred for treatment placement following discharge

- Outpatient BH after-hours crisis response (24/7 emergent response)
- Crisis Line/Warm Line/Teen Line
- Mobile Crisis Team
- Next Day Appointments

#### Heroin and Prescription Opiate Addiction Task Force – MIDD Sales Tax

#### **Prevention:**

- Raise awareness & knowledge of the possible adverse effects of opioid use, including overdose and opioid use disorder
- Promote safe storage/disposal of meds
- Improve screening practices to prevent use

#### Heroin and Prescription Opiate Addiction Task Force - MIDD Sales Tax

#### **Treatment:**

 Create innovative low-barrier treatment access near where people live – *low-barrier buprenorphine treatment, MOUD in Shelters/encampments, jail buprenorphine, treatment on demand*


