


STRUGGLES AND SOLUTIONS IN A REMOTE LEGAL SYSTEM ENVIRONMENT

"BECAUSE THE DELIVERY OF JUSTICE SERVICES IS ESSENTIAL DURING TIMES OF EMERGENCY, JUDICIAL BRANCH LEADERS KNEW WE HAD TO INNOVATE WAYS TO SERVE THE PUBLIC AND CONTINUE COURT OPERATIONS IN THE FACE OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC. BEGINNING IN LATE FEBRUARY WE BEGAN MODIFYING SYSTEMS AT EVERY LEVEL OF COURT TO PROTECT PUBLIC AND STAFF SAFETY, WHILE REACHING OUT TO STAKEHOLDERS TO CONTINUALLY ASSESS, ADJUST AND COLLABORATE AS THE PANDEMIC MOVED FORWARD. MANY HAVE DESCRIBED THE PROCESS AS REBUILDING A PLANE WHILE FLYING IT — BUT WE'VE STAYED ON COURSE."


