RESOLUTION R- 5531

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AUTHORIZING A COMMUNITY GUN BUY-BACK PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, On November 6, 2018, the voters of Kirkland approved Proposition 1 for funding enhanced police services and 2 community safety, which included funding for suicide prevention, 3 firearms safety, and safe storage training; and 4 5

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WHEREAS, since 2019, there has been an upward trend in 6 7 the number of firearm-related incidents occurring within the community; and 8

10 WHEREAS, reducing the number of available firearms in the community contributes to an overall strategy to address gun 11 violence; and 12 13

WHEREAS, gun buy-back programs, where individuals are 14 provided some form of compensation to relinquish firearms they 15 16 possess to the police department, provide a strategy to reduce the number of firearms in the community, promote awareness of 17 18 gun violence, and encourage safe disposal opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes a gun buy-back program 20 21 can promote gun safety, reduce gun violence within the community, and reduce the likelihood of accidental firearms 22 23 injuries and suicides by firearms. 24

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the 25 City of Kirkland as follows: 26 27

28 <u>Section 1</u>. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to create and implement a gun buy-back program using 29 funds from Proposition 1. 30 31

Section 2. For each firearm relinquished as part of the gun 32 buy-back program, the Kirkland Police Department will check the 33 serial number against national databases to determine whether 34 the firearm was reported stolen or linked to a crime. To the extent 35 possible, firearms that are reported stolen should be returned to 36 their rightful owners and firearms that are linked to crimes should 37 be transferred to appropriate outside agencies as necessary. 38 Firearms that are not stolen or linked to crime will be melted as 39 part of the Police Department's annual firearm destruction 40 41 process.
