



Updated Plan Review Guide

- Updated <u>Housing-focused Comprehensive Plan</u>
 Review Guide
- Includes **common gaps** identified during early plan reviews:
 - o Prioritizing housing needs of extremely low-income households
 - o Missing data points and analysis
 - o Incomplete documentation of exclusive and discriminatory land use and housing practices and adopting intentional, targeted actions to repair harm
 - o Geographic distribution of allowed housing types
- Includes references to suggested ways to align,
 FAQs, and other resources

HIJT Peer Review Pilot Concluded

AHC ended the pilot on June 6 due to:

- Administrative burden and bottlenecks
- Limited capacity
- Putting peer reviewers in a politically uncomfortable position

Future Plan Review Activity

- Review jurisdictions' submissions and prepare letters for AHC approval
- Reach out to jurisdictions that have not yet submitted to the plan review program
- Brief the GMPC throughout 2024

- 3. Execute a housing-focused comprehensive plan review program
 - In 2024, staff are focused on providing robust and timely technical assistance
- **4. Inform** development of annual monitoring systems to assess progress toward implementation of the housing-related components of comprehensive plans
 - Committee will finalize in 2025
- 5. Support state and federal affordable housing solutions
- **6. Recommend** AHC charter amendments and/or other governance structures to the Growth Management Planning Council to improve AHC effectiveness in meeting its goals
 - Committee will finalize in early 2025, with input from Community Partners Table
