Public Health:

- New call center

Small Business Grants

Omnichannel:

Website, social media, phone, email and text messages, virtual public meetings, and a digital town hall platform.

Digital Assistants on Four new channels:

Web, Text, Voice, and Social

Community connectedness:

Grant program of \$2.2 million: funds to six school districts, 18 community organizations and the University of Washington to develop:

- Community area networks and provide households and students with new computing devices, subsidized internet access, digital skills training and translation of student materials for remote on-line learning.
- Internet Action Crisis Team (I-ACT):
 - Drive-in Wi-Fi Hotspots
 - Free public WiFi
 - Personal devices/tablets and internet subscriptions for students.


