

Fireworks Display Permit Information

Requirements and Deadline:

Per International Fire Code 2021 edition, Chapter 56, King County Code (KCC) <u>Title 17</u>, Revised Code of Washington (RCW) <u>70.77</u>, and Washington Amended Code (WAC) <u>212-17-060</u>, a permit is required for the discharge of fireworks.

Please review the information listed below for the permit requirements. A complete Fireworks Display Permit Application packet must be submitted to the County at least **20-days** prior to the date of the display.

Public fireworks display: A King County Fireworks Display Permit is required to discharge fireworks that are larger than consumer fireworks and designed primarily to produce visible or audible displays for the public. A Fireworks Display Permit is required from both the State and County Fire Marshal.

Religious or Private Organization fireworks discharge: A King County Fireworks Permit is required to discharge consumer fireworks for religious or private organization events. There is no fee associated with a permit for a religious event. [KCC §17.11.040(E)]

Washington State Purchase and Discharge of Consumer Fireworks by a Private or Religious Organization

- 1. Complete list of fireworks to be discharged (type, size, quantity)
- 2. Site Plan to include the following:
 - Location of fireworks discharge area
 - Location and distance of discharge area from all buildings, trees, roads, and public viewing areas
 - Manner and place of storage of fireworks prior to display
- 3. A copy of the applicant's Pyrotechnic Operator License. Link to application form if needed.
- 4. Certificate of Insurance with King County and its employees named as additional insured
- 5. A refundable cash deposit of \$150.00 for site clean-up.
