

# **Private Swimming Pools or Spas**

**Exemption:** The following pools, when used accessory to individual dwelling units in single family homes and duplexes, are exempt from a building permit:

- Prefabricated swimming pools installed entirely above ground, are less than 24-inches deep, and do not exceed 5,000 gallons.
- Prefabricated swimming pools installed for temporary use of less than three months per year.

### Building Permit Submittal

- Residential Accessory Building and Miscellaneous Structure Permits, <u>Overview</u> available on <u>MyBuildingPermit.com</u>
- Private Swimming Pool or Spa Worksheet (see page 2)
- Site Plan: The site plan is required to give property dimensions, show any adjacent streets, indicate septic system location, if applicable, and show the position of the house on the lot. If a fence is used as part of the pool barrier, please identify its location on the site plan. The drawing must be representative of the lot. See the <u>Residential Site Plan Requirements</u> Handout.
- Structural Plans/Working Drawings: Construction drawings with engineering calculations or an approved ICC ES report demonstrating compliance with the current International Residential Code (IRC) and International Swimming Pool and Spa Code (ISPSC). The specific layout of the pool and the Access Barrier drawn at ¼"=1 ft. scale is required.
- Energy Code Compliance: Provide information and specifications on pool heaters, heater controls, vapor-retardant cover, pool pumps and pump controls.
- Public Health Approval: If the property is served by on-site sewage system (septic system), Public Health approval is required for the location of the pool. Prior to submission of a building permit application for the pool, contact Public Health to start the <u>Public Health permit application process</u>.
