

Residential Accessory Building or Miscellaneous Structures Permit

Residential Accessory Buildings are detached buildings and structures accessory to and associated with a primary single-family or multifamily structure. An Accessory Building does not include a dwelling unit, examples of an Accessory Building include a garage, storage building or carport.

Residential Miscellaneous Structures include construction such as fences, pools, retention walls, vaults and other similar structures.

A separate Residential Accessory Building or Miscellaneous Structures Permit is not required if the applicant is submitting for a Residential, New Construction or Residential, Remodel and Addition permit. Accessory Buildings and Miscellaneous Structures can be included as a combination permit.

When is a building permit required?

The International Building Code exempts certain structures from needing a building permit if they are less than 200 square feet and unconditioned space. Exempted structures do not require a building permit from the County but must comply with all King County code requirements.

Accessory structure location, lot coverage and height

Due to the wide range of zoning conditions, possible critical areas conditions, and Seattle – King County Health Department requirements, applicants should first undertake basic research for your property. See the Property Research Guide and Worksheet for more information. Please note that Permitting staff will not perform basic property research for you unless there are special circumstances or needs.
