**Today's Meeting**

At today's meeting, the Growth Management Planning Council (GMPC) is scheduled to adopt its 2025 Work Program.

**Overview**

The draft 2025 Work Program was prepared by the Interjurisdictional Staff Team (IJT) and discussed by GMPC at its December 2024 meeting. The 2025 Work Program includes standard briefings, follow up work from 2024 topics, and some new topics.

**Standard briefings**

- Includes recurring topics such as annual annexation updates, annual legislative session updates, and other updates of interest to the GMPC.

**Follow-up on 2024 topics:**

- **Affordable Housing Committee work:** Updates related to the work of the Affordable Housing Committee (AHC) including the AHC review of Comprehensive Plans. AHC charter amendments are scheduled for action near the end of the year
- **Growth Target Reconciliation Process:** Continued work on a potential reconciliation of the adopted growth targets for the City of Carnation and City of Snoqualmie. Action is scheduled at the beginning of the year if GMPC is ready.

**Returning topics**

- **Countywide and Regional Centers Designations:** IJT receipt of applications for center designation in late 2025, with GMPC review and potential approval in early 2026. The work will include consideration of both *countywide* centers and new *regional* centers that need to first be designated in the CPPs before they can be considered by the Puget Sound Regional Council.
- **Tribal Coordination:** Work with tribes to fulfill state requirements to include tribes in countywide planning. Begin with level setting and understanding work done in other venues to support coordination between jurisdictions and tribes on countywide growth management topics.
- **Greenhouse Gas Emissions:** Discuss the work of the King County Cities Climate Collaboration and potentially countywide planning work on this topic.

Shown on the following page is a proposed schedule for the 2025 GMPC meetings. The schedule illustrates how the topics will be presented at GMPC. GMPC meetings will continue in a hybrid format with a Zoom option and In-Person option at the Sound Transit building.

**Future Activity**

The 2025 Work Program will be brought to the GMPC for adoption at its first meeting in 2025.
