Subject Property: Approximately 822 acres of the Palmer Coking Coal Company (PCCC) property planned Douglas fir thinning unit, located generally south and east of the Green River in southeast King County. The property is located within the Green River Gorge Historic District (GRGHD), a Washington Heritage Register site, a parallelogram of properties generally located along the Green River from the Green River Gorge Bridge to the Kummer Bridge. Please see the attached map contained within the National Register of Historic Places Inventory – Nomination Form dated circa July-October 1969.

This larger PCCC properties are the site of currently proposed forest practice activities including clear-cut logging and forest thinning together with new road construction (from the DNR Forest Practice Application, within the context of the GRGHD. Also, see the attached Green River Gorge Historic District – PCCC Overlay color aerial print with the GRGHD boundaries outlined in black and the PCCC lot boundaries shown in yellow and red. King County Assessor tax parcel numbers which comprise the subject properties are attached.

As per WAC 222-16-050 (1)(f)(ii) and (iv)(B), Palmer Coking Coal Company’s proposed forest practice activities will be classified as a Class IV-special forest practice unless a management plan is agreed to by the landowner, affected tribes, and the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation.

As background, Palmer Coking Coal Company has reviewed WISAARD and found no identified historic or cultural properties inventoried within our proposed activity area, beyond the above mentioned GRGHD. PCCC personnel and our contracted forester, Dan Bruner dba Bruner Forestry, Inc. have spent considerable time during their layout of our planned harvest unit and the area of our proposed new road construction which are located within the GRGHD. We have visually surveyed these areas within the GRGHD for any occurrences of historic mining activity, mine shafts, tailings, abandoned equipment or any other signs of historic human activity. We did observe four such features: 1) a “Graded Area” detailed in that Report dated May 2, 2006 by Icicle Creek Engineers, Inc., Project No. 0102-010); (as reviewed by King County Department of Development & Environmental Services under File No. L06SA435 and recorded under a Sensitive Area Notice, King County Recording No. 20060808001130); 2) an historic gravel pit (not PCCC property); 3) historic access roads to and through the subject property including the Enumclaw-Franklin Road S.E., a county road; and 4) past timber

harvest activities. Those past timber harvest activities include early 1900s clear-cut of portions of the property and selective logging of the property (primarily Douglas fir) from the 1920s until the early 2010s. Some of more recent areas of even-age harvest of timber (dating from the late 1970s) were reforested by plantings of 9' x 9' spaced Douglas fir seedlings. There have also been regular road improvement and maintenance activities throughout the property.

I have also drawn upon my own knowledge as the Operating Manager of Palmer Coking Coal Company (1982 – 2013), as an active member of the Black Diamond Historical Society, as a contributing writer to the Black Diamond Historical Society Newsletter, as a contributing writer to HistoryLink.org, the online Washington State history website (see reference below), and as a columnist for the Maple Valley newspaper, the [Voice of the Valley](http://www.voiceofthevalley.com), where my column “When Coal Was King” runs weekly. My uncle Jack A. Morris, former President of Palmer Coking Coal Company, Inc. and Pacific Coast Coal & Oil Company, Inc. was instrumental in negotiating and implementing the 1973 sale of property within the Green River Gorge Conservation Area to Washington State Parks & Recreation, which created an interest in this historic district. Based upon my extensive knowledge of the mining in this area and on this property, which I have managed for our various family-owned companies since 1979, there are several historic artifacts or features located on PCCC land holdings near this area of proposed and future harvest / road construction activity:

- 1) A graded area related to former depressions in the glacial outwash soils located along a east-west axis, generally located in the northern reach of the property in Section 19-21-7 marked “Graded Area” as shown in Figure 3 of the Icicle Creek Engineers Report dated May 2, 2006 (Project No. 0102-010);
- 2) An historic gravel mining operation located near the center of Section 30-21-7 and comprised of King County Assessor tax parcel numbers 302107-9025 and -9042 (Note: this property is not owned by Palmer Coking Coal Company although PCCC does own an adjacent property permitted as a surface gravel mining operation);
- 3) The Enumclaw-Franklin Road S.E. (construction dating from approximately 1917) and other historic access roads used to access the property since approximately the 1920s.

The following is Palmer Coking Coal Company’s proposed management plan for protection of historic or cultural resources that may, in fact, exist but have not been identified within the area of our proposed forest practices that might be discovered within the proposed forest practice application activity area during our planned operations.

The over-riding objective of this management plan is to provide adequate protection of important cultural or historic resources, which may exist within the area of the Palmer Coking Coal Company's proposed forest practice activities, so as to be acceptable to affected tribes and the Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP). In the event that any archaeological or historic materials are encountered during our planned forest practice activities, work in the immediate area – initially within 100 feet – of the encounter will be immediately stopped and the following actions taken:

- Implement reasonable measures to protect the discovery site, including appropriate stabilization or covering; and
- Take reasonable steps to protect the confidentiality of the discovery site; and
- Take reasonable steps to restrict access to the discovery site.

Palmer Coking Coal Company will also notify affected tribes and all appropriate county, state and federal agencies, including DAHP, of the discovery. In that event, Palmer Coking Coal Company personnel agree to meet with affected tribes, DAHP and other appropriate agencies with the objective of agreeing on a plan of action to remove, avoid or protect the discovery site and associated cultural materials (if present) at the discovery site, and / or disposition of cultural materials, if present.

If ground disturbing activities encounter human skeletal remains during the course of our planned activities, then all activity will cease that may cause further disturbance to those remains. The area of the find will be secured and protected from further disturbance. The finding of human skeletal remains will be reported to the county medical examiner / coroner and local law enforcement in the most expeditious manner possible. The remains will not be touched, moved, or further disturbed. The county medical examiner / coroner will assume jurisdiction over the human skeletal remains and make a determination of whether those remains are forensic or non-forensic. If the county medical examiner or coroner determines the remains to be non-forensic, then they will report that finding to DAHP who will then take jurisdiction over the remains. DAHP will notify any appropriate cemeteries and all affected tribes of the find. The State Physical Anthropologist will make a determination of whether the remains are Indian or Non-Indian and report that finding to any appropriate cemeteries and the affected tribes. DAHP will then handle all consultation with the affected parties as to the future preservation, excavation, and disposition of the remains.

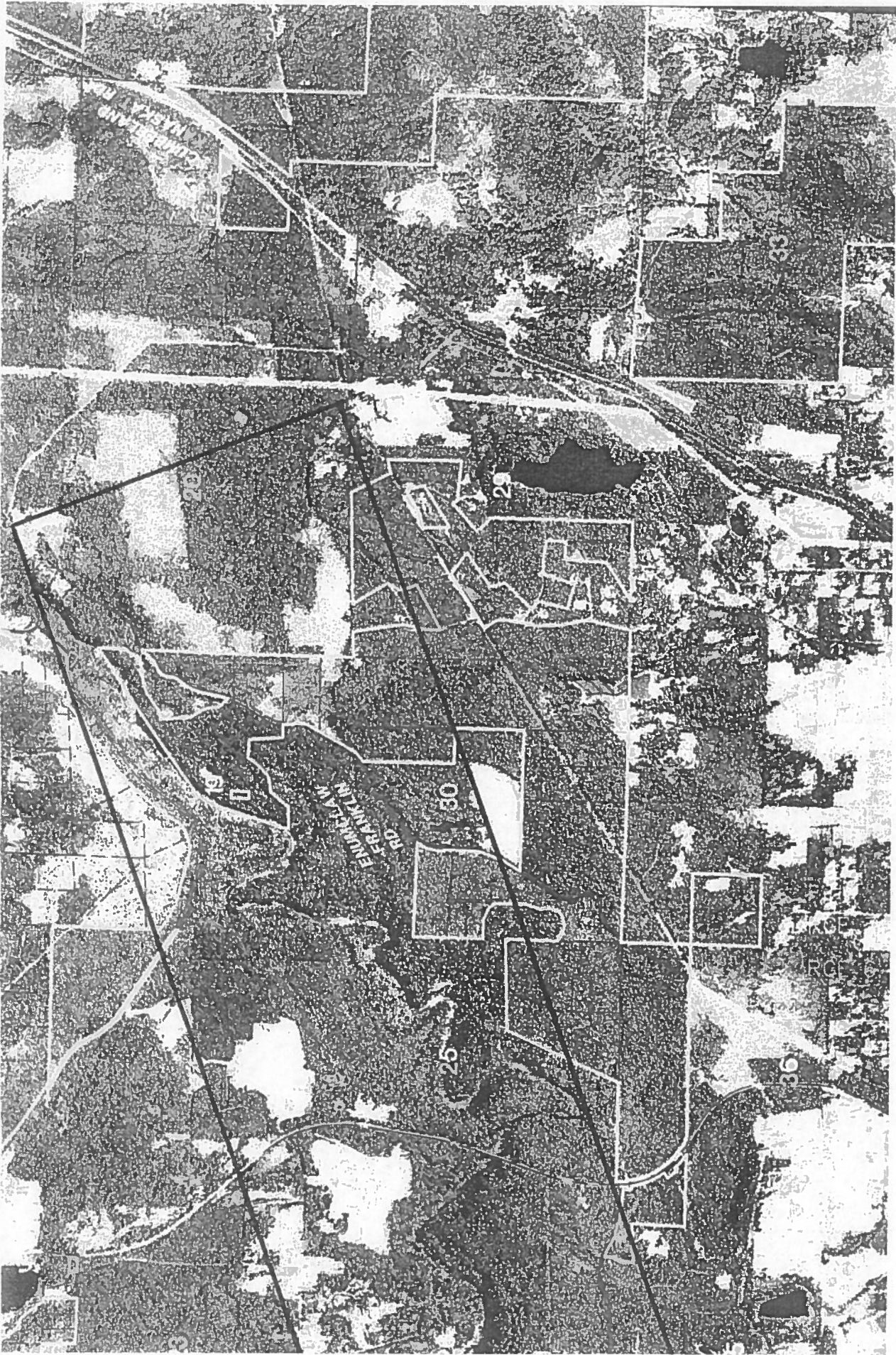

Dear Bill:

Thank you for the management plan and for the extensive background information on the property in question. I have reviewed the information on behalf of the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe's Preservation Program and concur with your plan. I would like to add a couple of comments as well. The Muckleshoot Tribe pays close attention to activities along the Green River in this area and does hold information on precontact place names and use of the vicinity. Prehistoric lithic scatters have been identified on similar landforms in the project vicinity and may occur within the project area. Also, Warren KingGeorge, the Muckleshoot Tribe's Oral Historian, may have additional information on plant resources that are of historic importance to the Tribe which may occur in the project area. I am copying him on this email and will update him on your project plans.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment, and for keeping the Tribe informed. Myself or Melissa Calvert, Director of the Preservation Program, can be listed as contacts in case a resource is found and the Tribe needs to be notified.

Charlotte / Jim -

Yesterday, Dan Bruner turned in a FPA at our request. Today, Charlotte called Dan inquiring about the "archaeology" hit which DNR's computer system came up with.

As you may remember, in May 2013 we had a similar result for FPA #2416222. After discussing this issue with DNR we discovered that the same "archaeology" hit would result for any PCCC property located within in this district which was allegedly "established" from an undated, unsigned report from 1969 of dubious quality and factually inaccurate.

Nonetheless, we prepared a revised DAHP Log # 051312-08-DNR to cover **all** PCCC and related LLC properties in the so-called Green River Gorge Historic District (GRGHD). Our DAHP covered all of the 822 acres which PCCC and related LLCs own in this district. The plan was vetted through Stephanie Kramer of DAHP and certified letters were sent to all the affected tribes. In addition, numerous e-mails, letters, and phone calls were placed to each tribe representative.

I have attached a full copy of our DAHP Log # 051313-08-DNR, together with copies of all contact efforts sent to the tribes. The FPA which Dan Bruner submitted yesterday is partially contained within the DAHP plan which we have previously had approved. However, the majority of the property proposed for thinning in the current proposed FPA is outside the boundaries of the GRGHD

You may add the attached information to the current FPA application as evidence of the DAHP process.

Dear Ms. Murphey; Mr. Reynon, and Mr. Mullen-Moses:

Pursuant to the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) log number referenced above, the Department of Natural Resources has required that we contact tribes in our area due to a cultural resource / archaeology notation on properties Palmer Coking Coal Company (PCCC) plans to log in Sections 19 and 30; Township 21 North, Range 7 East, and Section 25, 35, and 36; Township 21 North, Range 7 East, King County, generally south and east of the Green River. These combined properties, comprised of 60 parcels, total about 822 acres. The referenced cultural resource / archaeology notation is the result of a 1969 nomination form for the Green River Gorge Historic District (GRGHD) by an unknown person. We would like to speak with you in order to learn of any potential cultural resources or archaeology resources which have been noted with respect to our property, as it applies to forest practice permits we are seeking.

This property had been clearcut from the early 1900s, and selectively logged from the 1930s through the 2012. We are planning on future harvests consisting of clearcuts and thinnings of portions of the property, which are predominately Douglas fir with mixed species such as alder, hemlock, and maple. We are also going to improve a road. Our


company has owned this property since the early 1950s. I have personally walked all of this property. I've never noticed any particular historic resources, except those noted in the draft Management Plan. The current FPA application is referenced above.

The tax parcel numbers for properties some of which are included in the Green River Gorge Historic District are attached as part of the draft Management. The GRGHD property is outlined on the attached color property map with PCCC properties outlined in red and yellow.

I am also attaching a copy of the GRGHD Report which Stephanie Kramer of the Washington State Office of Archeology and Historic Preservation has provided to us. The report concerns portions of property which we have historically managed and are continuing to plan on logging or thinning together with road building activities. I am looking forward to hearing from any or all of you so that we can move forward with our Forest Practice Applications.
