February 7-10



Driveway access on the Alternative Route will be limited as the temporary bridge is moved and installed

Construction begins to repair the slide on SE Edgewick Road



During construction crews are planning to work six to seven days a week from 7 am to 4:30 pm each day. You will likely hear:


- Noise and odor from saw cutting, jackhammers, excavators, generators and pumps.
- Increased truck traffic for hauling materials to and from the construction site.

Alternative Route Disclaimer

If you elect to use the Alternative Route, then in addition to driving with standard care and attention, the following safety practices are strongly encouraged:

- Limit use of trail to cars and light trucks
- No trailers are allowed
- No flammable materials are allowed
- Keep speed under 10 MPH
- No deliveries
- Drive with headlights on at all times
- Be alert for other traffic on the trail, and be prepared to back up for long distances to accommodate passing oncoming vehicles.
- Do not stop on the trail
- Large animals are allowed on the trail
- Follow the signed detour route
- If you have an emergency, call 911


