Notice of upcoming weekend construction

As soon as Friday, January 19, crews are scheduled to begin roadway restoration on the west side of Eastlake Ave E between Roy St and Harrison St. At the intersection of Mercer St and Eastlake Ave E, there will be one lane of alternating traffic. Throughout the rest of the project area, one lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction. Work hours for road restoration are 7:00 pm Friday, January 19 to 3:30 pm Saturday, January 20 and 7:00 am to 3:30 pm Sunday, January 21. Traffic lanes will be restored as soon as Monday, January 22.

PLEASE NOTE: Construction schedules may shift due to inclement weather, delays with material shipments, or other unforeseen circumstances. This project has a temporary noise variance that will allow weekend work; however, we will prioritize completing high-impact work before 10 pm and after 8 am.

What to expect

Construction on the Eastlake Layover Facility will continue through the summer. Typical work hours are Monday through Friday, 7 am to 4 pm. Some nighttime and weekend work may be required. You can expect:

- Temporary parking restrictions
- Periodic lane closures
- ► Flaggers to direct traffic around the work areas
- Detours for people walking, rolling, and biking
- Construction staging and parking impacts near the construction site
- Some sidewalk, intersection and lane closures
- Typical construction impacts, such as noise, truck activity and dust and debris

Notice of upcoming weekend construction

As soon as Saturday, January 6, crews are scheduled to set up traffic control and install underground electrical utilities on the west side of Eastlake Ave E between Roy St and Harrison St. Once the underground utility work is complete, crews will begin to restore the roadway. One traffic lane will always be maintained in each direction on Eastlake Ave E. Weekend work hours are between 7 am and 4 pm, Saturday through Sunday. This work is expected to continue over the weekends through February.

PLEASE NOTE: Construction schedules may shift due to inclement weather, delays with material shipments, or other unforeseen circumstances. This project has a temporary noise variance that will allow weekend work to start at 7 am; however, high-impact work will be prioritized to start after 9 am.
