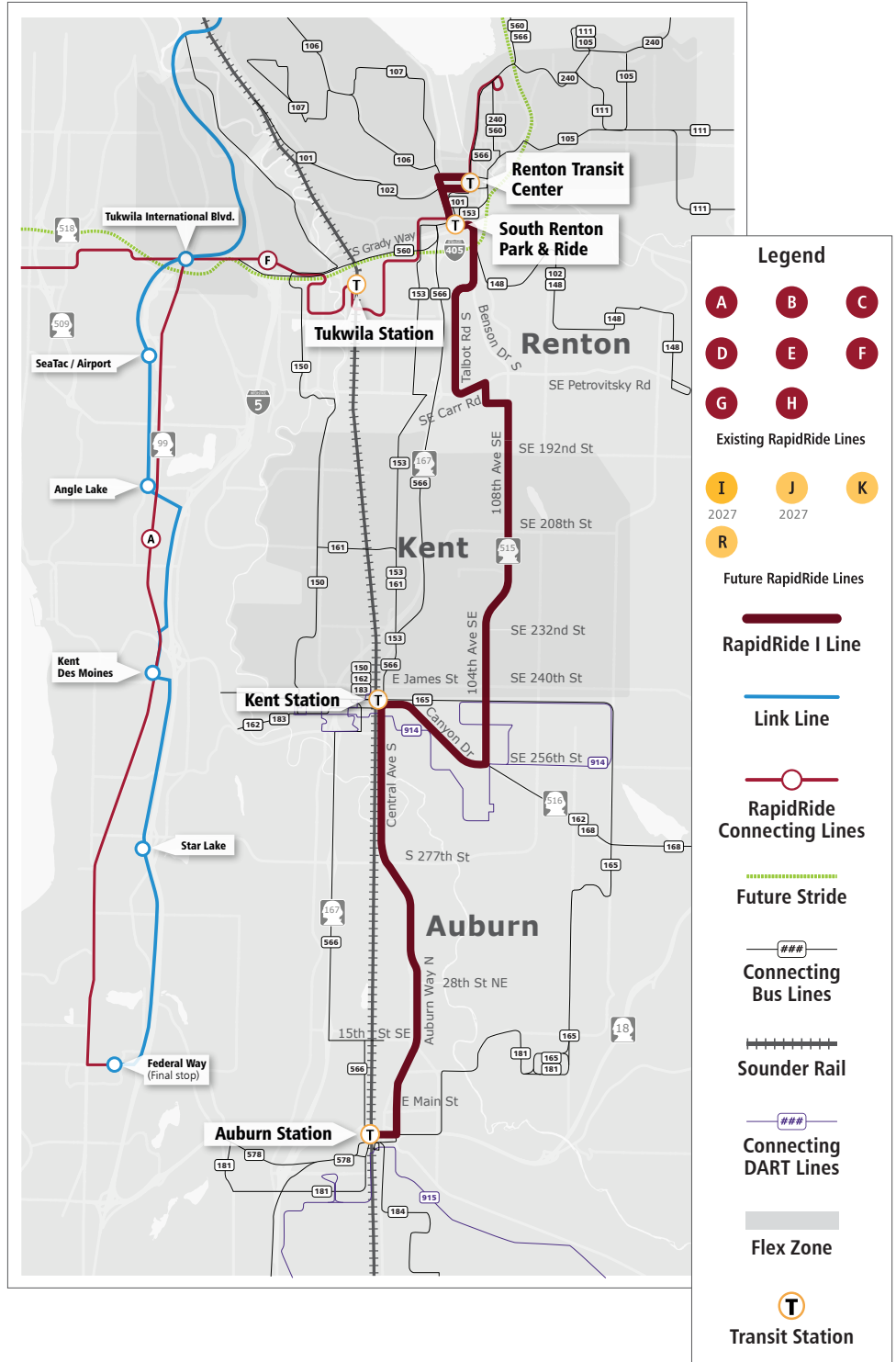
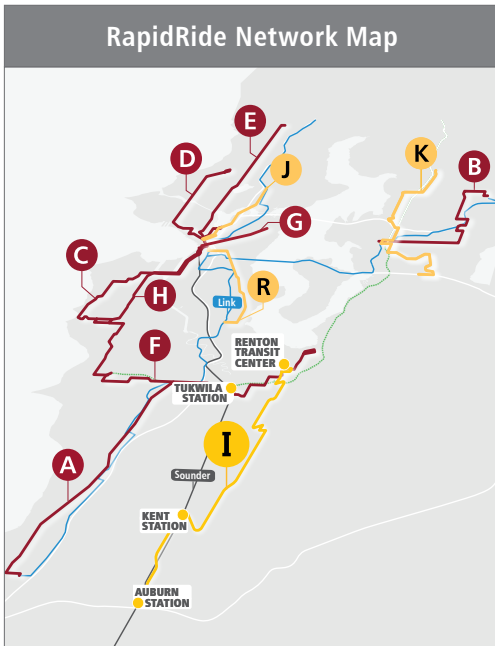


# RapidRide I Line

### About the RapidRide I Line

RapidRide I Line will offer fast and reliable bus service along a 17-mile route. It will connect major transit hubs: Renton transit center, and Kent and Auburn stations; as well as RapidRide F Line; Sounder buses; Sounder train; and local bus service. This will make it easier for people to transfer between local and regional buses and trains. RapidRide I Line will improve north-south transportation in south King County, giving riders better access to where they need to go.





Renton | SE 180th St.

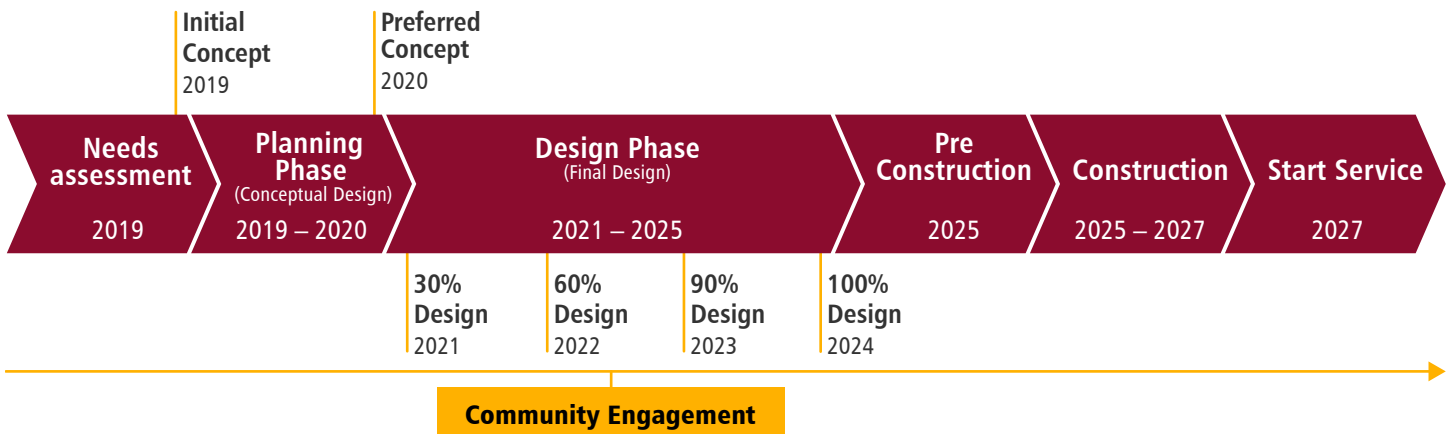


Auburn | Auburn Wa N and 1st St. NE

## What to expect during construction

Metro is starting construction this winter 2026. Typical work hours are Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., with some nighttime and weekend work. During construction, you can expect:

- Temporary parking restrictions
- Periodic lane and driveway closures
- Large machinery and truck activity
- Construction staging and parking impacts near some construction sites
- Some sidewalk, intersection and lane closures
- Detours for people walking, biking and rolling
- Temporary bus detours and bus stop relocations for Route 160 and other area transit and bus routes
- Flaggers to direct traffic around work areas
