RE: Death of William L. Stokes

Dear Executive Constantine:

On May 17, 2017 the King County Prosecutor's Office received investigative materials from the Federal Way Police Department concerning the shooting death of William L. Stokes by a Kent Police Officer on March 23, 2017. Pursuant to Executive Order (PHL 7-1-1), this office has reviewed those materials and recommends that an inquest be ordered. The Executive's Order mandates an inquest to investigate "any death involving a member of any law enforcement agency within King County while in the performance of his/her duties."

In this instance, Des Moines Police responded to a 911 call from Stokes' roommate, Shawn Herbert. Herbert reported that Stokes had refused to let him out of his room and had threated to kill Herbert and himself. After several attempts by Des Moines Police to resolve the hostage situation with negotiation and the deployment of Tasers, Valley SWAT was called to assist. Shortly after SWAT officer Brian Lewis arrived, Stokes opened the door armed with a machete raised above his head. After ignoring numerous verbal commands and attempting to secure himself back in the house where Herbert was still captive, Stokes was shot by SWAT Officer Lewis of the Kent Police Department. Stokes collapsed inside the front door of the residence and was later pronounced dead at the scene. I would be more than happy to meet with you if you would like to discuss this matter in further detail.

If you agree that an inquest should be held in this matter, we shall assign a deputy prosecutor. Please contact our office with your decision as soon as possible. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me at (206) 477-1970.
