How to

Ask for an Order of Default

If the Respondent has not appeared

Use this packet ONLY if:

The other party was properly served, and if he/she did not appear at any hearings or file any documents in your case and the other party has missed the deadline to respond:

20 days	If respondent was served in person in Washington state
60 days	If respondent was served in person outside of Washington state or by publication.
90 days	If respondent was served by mail.

If it has been more than a year since the other party was personally served or served by mail, you are required to schedule a hearing before the Chief UFC Judge and provide the other party with notice of the hearing. Please see Facilitator instruction "Default if Respondent has Appeared."

Talk to a lawyer if you can

- There is a fee required for the clerk's office to present your documents to the commissioner. If you believe you are eligible for a fee waiver, speak to a clerk.
- The clerk will notify you of the commissioner's decision by the method you selected in the Ex Parte via the Clerk Coversheet.
- After the Order has been signed the Clerk will automatically file the original documents and return a copy of the Order to you via the method you requested.
- Once you receive the signed Order on Motion for Default and you are ready to finalize your case, you can visit the Family Law Information Center for instructions on how to schedule and prepare for your final hearing.

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
