How to

Ask for an Order of Default

If the Respondent has not appeared

Use this packet ONLY if:

The other party was properly served, and if he/she did not appear at any hearings or file any documents in your case and the other party has missed the deadline to respond:

20 days	If respondent was served in person in Washington state
60 days	If respondent was served in person outside of Washington state or by publication.
90 days	If respondent was served by mail.

If it has been more than a year since the other party was personally served or served by mail, you are required to schedule a hearing in family law and serve the other party with notice of the hearing. Please see Facilitator instruction "Default in Family Law."

Talk to a lawyer, if you can

These instructions have been developed by the King County Superior Court Family Law Information Center. They are not intended to be a substitute for legal advice. They provide only legal *information*. It's a good idea to talk to a lawyer before you file any forms.

- After the Order has been signed the Clerk will automatically file the original documents and return a copy of the Order to you via the method you requested.

 visit the Family Law Information Center for instructions on how to schedule and prepare for your final
 hearing.

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
