MARKING OF DEPOSITION DESIGNATIONS AND PROPOSED ORDER

Please follow the guidelines below when marking depositions to be presented to Judge Richardson for use in a trial in her courtroom. This should be done electronically if possible and transmitted to the court via e-working copies.

- The parties must cooperate using one set of depositions marked for the judge's consideration, as follows:
 - o Moving Party marks with brackets or highlights their designations in a particular color (i.e. yellow highlighter).
 - Each Opposing Party states their objection and basis therefore in a comment box next to the designation.
 - Opposing Party highlights counter-designations in a different color from that used by the moving party (i.e. green highlighter)
 - o Moving Party states their objection and basis therefore in a comment box next to the designation.
 - This should be provided to the Court at least five court days prior to trial, along with all other pretrial materials.
- A proposed order in substantially the following format should also be provided to the Court in Word format at least five court days prior to trial.
