

SCHOOL DISTRICT REFERRAL KING COUNTY EDUCATION REENGAGEMENT TEAM (KCERT) & COMMUNTY ATTENDANCE SUPPORT TEAM (CAST) Send completed referrals to <u>truancy@kingcounty.gov</u>

The King County Community Attendance Support Team (CAST) meets with students and families to identify and address barriers to school attendance. The CAST is made up of members representing community agencies that provide a variety of opportunities, supports, and resources to youth and families across King County. The CAST is coordinated by the King County Superior Court Becca Team in collaboration with the King County Prosecuting Attorney's Office Education Reengagement Program, and King County School Districts. School districts can make a referral for either a CAST meeting or at the family's request, support from the KCERT in obtaining supplemental services to reduce or eliminate barriers to attendance.

Recommended steps prior to making a CAST referral:

- Absences verified/attempted to be verified
- Attempted to inform the parent(s)/guardian in writing or by phone that the student has been absent without excuse in a language **in which the parent is fluent** (Required by RCW 28A.225.020).
- Held or scheduled a conference to discuss attendance with the student and parent(s)/guardian after a third unexcused absence (Required by RCW 28A.225.018 & RCW 225.020). For more information see "Conference" handout.

• IEP, 504, or dependency team has been contacted and consulted to consider the absences (if applicable). *Operation of a community engagement board or referral to CAST does not excuse a district from the obligation of filing a petition-Districts are still required to file a petition under RCW 28A.225.030*. RCW 28A.225.030 states that districts are required to file a petition IF the actions taken by a school district under RCW 28A.225.020 are not successful in substantially reducing absences from public school, after the child's seventh unexcused absence within any month during the current school year and not later than the 15th unexcused absence during the current school year.
