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The Northeast Sammamish Sewer & Water District "the District" proposes to annex approximately 1.1 acres in the City of Sammamish adjacent to the District's current boundary for purposes of sewer service. The District proposes this annexation based upon a property owner petition. RCW 57.24 (Annexation of Unincorporated Territory) which permits annexation of territory by the District Board of Commissioners. A Resolution for Annexation was approved by the District in December 2024.

This proposed annexation area "the Territory" is located within the Urban Growth Area as identified under the State Growth Management Act (GMA) and the King County Comprehensive Plan. It is zoned R4 by the City of Sammamish. District officials report that there is currently a single-family residence on the Territory, but further states that it understands that the property owner intends to demolish said single-family residence and build three new single-family residences. The District has an approved Sewer Comprehensive Plan, but the Territory is not currently included in said plan. The District reports that the Territory will be added as part of its next plan update.

The Territory is currently located within the boundary of the Sammamish Plateau Water & Sewer District "Sammamish Plateau." Sammamish Plateau currently provides water service to the Territory and plans to continue to do so after annexation to District. The two districts would afterwards overlap. District officials state the District has been identified as the logical provider of sewer services to the Territory as Sammamish Plateau does not currently have sewer lines in the area while the District has a sewer main that fronts the Territory. Sammamish Plateau consented to annexation of the Territory to the District for purposes of sewer service via its Resolution No. 5231 on October 16, 2023. The District reports that sewer connection will be accomplished via installation of side sewers that will be connected to an existing 8 inch sewer main that already fronts the Territory. Further, the District states that it has adequate capacity to serve the full development potential of the Territory. Lastly, the District states that its sewage is transmitted to King County for treatment.

The District provided its current sewer fee schedule which would be applicable if residences were built in the Territory and connected to the District sewer main. That current fee schedule is as follows:

- General Facilities Charge: \$5,890 per Equivalent Residential Unit
- Side Sewer Permit: \$285 per Equivalent Residential Unit
- District Bi-Monthly Sewer Rate: \$183.30 of which \$116.56 is for King County Treatment

The District reports that the Territory would continue to be served by Sammamish Plateau for purposes of water service after annexation. Additionally, the District states that there would be no change in fire protection service to the Territory from Eastside Fire & Rescue. Finally, the District states that annexation of the Territory would not affect the finances Sammamish Plateau, Eastside Fire & Rescue or the City of Sammamish.

This annexation was originally proposed by the property owner via its Petition as a transfer of part of the district pursuant to RCW 57.32.160. Further, Sammamish Plateau also requested that this action occur under that statute. However, in consultation with stakeholders, the Boundary Review Board's Executive Secretary "the Executive Secretary" requested that the District pursue this annexation via a petition-method annexation pursuant to RCW 57.24.070 as there would be no true transfer of territory due to Sammamish Plateau not de-annexing or withdrawing any territory. Alternatively, the Executive Secretary suggested that the two districts could enter into an agreement for a service area change pursuant to RCW 57.08.044. The District selected the petition-method annexation method described in its Notice of Intention. However, the Executive Secretary notates that prior documentation of this proposal including the property owner petition, the District's initial Resolution No. 4300 to pursue transfer of the Territory and also Sammamish Plateau's supporting Resolution No. 5231 reference a transfer of part of the district pursuant to RCW 57.32.160. Nevertheless, the Executive Secretary determined that this fact pattern is not sufficient to cause the Notice of Intention to be deemed incomplete.

District representatives report that the proposed action is consistent with applicable provisions of the Growth Management Act (RCW 36.70A.020), the King County Comprehensive Plan, King County Countywide Planning Policies and City of Sammamish policies. Regarding these policies, the District states the following:

"King County planning under the Growth Management Act has established the Urban Growth Boundary (UGB). The proposed properties are within the UGB." "King County Comprehensive Plan Policy F-255 slates that all new development shall be served by public sewers. Policy F-256 states that in the Urban Growth Area, King County and sewer utilities should jointly prioritize the replacement of on-site systems that serve existing development with public sewers, based on the risk of failure. City of Sammamish Policy UT.6.3 supports a long-term strategy to convert existing development from septic systems to sanitary sewer. Policy UT.6.4 supports development of a strategy for phased conversion to sewers."

"The proposed annexation would also comply with King County Countywide Planning Policies PF-1 and PF-12 which call for services to be established in all Urban Growth Areas."

*"The District prepares a comprehensive sewer plan that supports the City and County GMA requirements."* 

The District reports that the currently proposed annexation of the Territory by the District is consistent with the provisions of RCW 36.93 (Boundary Review Board Regulations). Regarding RCW 36.93.170, the District states: "This proposal is consistent with RCW 36.93.170 as it does not affect population density or zoning, it provides municipal sewer service where there currently is none and would have no effect on adjacent areas, economic and social interest or the local governmental structure of the county." Further, RCW 36.93.180 requires that such actions be evaluated with respect to nine objectives. The District has identified that the proposed annexation supports the objective or is not applicable in the following ways:
