#### SUMMARY ORDER

SUBJECT: Department of Local Services file no. ENFR140796

The Department asserts violations for (1) use and occupancy of a structure without final inspections and approval under B98M0739, (2) accumulation of inoperable vehicles and vehicle parts and parking vehicles (operable or inoperable) on non-impervious surfaces, and (3) accumulation of assorted rubbish, salvage, and debris. Mr. French does not challenge the existence of those violation, but raises issues related to the *remedy* for those violations.

Violations (2) and (3) are relatively straightforward. The Department required Mr. French to (2) remove inoperable vehicles and vehicle parts (or store them in a fully-enclosed building) and (3) remove the rubbish, salvage, and debris. Mr. French simply requests that he have until September 10 to complete these. Done.

The Department required Mr. French to (1a) submit a complete prescreening meeting request to determine whether B98M0739 will be renewed or a new permit application will be required or (1b) vacate the structure until final approval is obtained. Mr. French essentially makes two requests. The first is to have until September 10; that is not problematic.

The second, that he be allowed to complete his work under the current permit (i.e. to not have to apply for a new permit), it is a little more involved. If Mr. French submits a prescreening meeting request, and at that meeting the Department renews B98M0739, then there is no dispute; Mr. French will need to wrap up the B98M0739 permit. If, however, the Department determines that the remedy is for Mr. French to apply for new permit, that is something Mr. French disputes, presumably necessitating that we hold a hearing to decide that matter.

The most efficient way forward thus seems for us to:

- Sustain the notice and order related to violations (2) and (3), with a **September 10, 2020**, deadline for Mr. French to comply.
- Sustaining the notice and order related to violation (1), with a **September 10, 2020**, deadline for Mr. French to submit to the Department a complete prescreening meeting request. In the event the Department determines that a new permit will be required, we retain jurisdiction to reopen the case and weigh in on that issue.

If for some reason we have misunderstood the situation, by **August 31, 2020,** either party is free to file, with the examiner, a motion for reconsideration explaining why the examiner should not be dismissing this appeal. Filing a timely motion for reconsideration postpones the deadline (described below the signature line) for lodging an appeal.
