On January 3, 2025, King County For-Hire Licensing issued Citation 24-1150. As that document stated, any appeal had to be received by King County For-Hire Licensing by January 27, 2025 or the Citation would become a final determination. This deadline is based on KCC 20.22.080.B,

which requires appeals to be received within 24 days of the date the agency determination is issued.

Mr. Nirdosh's appeal is dated December 1, 2025. In his appeal letter, Mr. Nirdosh acknowledges that the appeal deadline had passed, but asks that the matter be heard because he believed his union would be handling the filing of his appeal in a timely manner.

On December 2, 2025, King County For-Hire Licensing filed a Motion to Dismiss the appeal as untimely.

Per KCC 20.22.080.H, where an appeal is untimely, the examiner "does not have jurisdiction to consider the appeal and the decision of the department ... becomes final and unreviewable." This is not a discretionary limitation on the examiner's jurisdiction. "The examiner cannot consider appeals that do not meet [the timeliness] requirements." Hearing Examiner Rule IV.B.4.

The appeal is accordingly DISMISSED, with prejudice, for lack of jurisdiction.

If we have misunderstood the situation, either party may email us a motion for reconsideration explaining why the appeal should not be dismissed. The motion must be received by **December 29, 2025**, or prior to any appeal deadline for judicial review, if applicable. If no motion is received, this Order of Dismissal shall be final and conclusive.
