On November 4, 2025, King County For-Hire Licensing issued a Notice and Order of Violation for Case #25-901. As that document stated, any appeal had to be received by King County For-Hire Licensing by December 1, 2025, or the notice and order would become a final determination. This deadline is based on KCC 20.22.080.B, which requires appeals to be received by the agency within 24 days of the date the agency determination is issued.

King County For-Hire Licensing filed a motion to dismiss the appeal as untimely. As stated in their Motion, Licensing received Muhammed Waggeh’s appeal on December 3, 2025; Mr. Waggeh’s appeal is dated December 3, 2025.

Per KCC 20.22.080.H, where an appeal is untimely, the examiner “does not have jurisdiction to consider the appeal and the decision of the department ... becomes final and unreviewable.”

The appeal is accordingly DISMISSED with prejudice, for lack of jurisdiction.

Any Motion for Reconsideration must be received by **January 13, 2026**, and will only be granted if the movant shows that this Order is based on erroneous information, failed to comply with existing laws, regulations, or adopted policies, or shows that a procedural error prevented consideration of directly affected persons’ interests. Hearing Examiner Rule XVI.A.3. If no motion is received, this Order of Dismissal shall be final and conclusive.
