SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Department's Recommendation: Contingently approve 4.00 acres for 20% of assessed value

PRELIMINARY REPORT:

On April 9, 2020, the Department of Natural Resources and Parks (DNRP) submitted its report on file no. E19CT027 to the Examiner.

PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the preliminary report and examining available information on file with the application, the Examiner conducted a public telephone hearing on the application on April 23, 2020.

Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the Hearing Examiner's Office.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS:

1. General Information:

2. The Applicants timely filed an application to King County for the Public Benefit Rating System (PBRS) program current use valuation of the property to begin in 2020. As required by law, notification of the application occurred.

3. A summary of relevant PBRS categories follows below. (Plain text represents a category an applicant requested an award for and that DNRP agrees is warranted. Any ~~strike through~~ represents a category an applicant requested an award for but that DNRP disagrees is warranted. Any *italics* represents a category an applicant did not request an award for, but that DNRP nonetheless concludes is warranted. And any **asterisk** represents a category where DNRP finds an award is warranted, but only if certain contingencies or conditions are met.)

4. The DNRP-recommended score of 23 points would result in a current use valuation of 20% of assessed value for the enrolled portion of the property. However, all points in all categories—and thus enrollment in the PBRS program itself—are conditioned on the Applicants controlling and eradicating the invasive species and non-native grass areas throughout the enrolling area, along with reforesting previously maintained/mowed areas of the property, via implementing an approved forest stewardship plan. The Applicants have submitted an approved forest stewardship plan addressing control, removal and replanting; the final plan must be approved by DNRP by **December 31, 2020**.
5. As to the land area contingently recommended for PBRS enrollment, the Applicants requested 4.00 acres and DNRP recommends the same. (Enrollment acreage is the entire parcel less the excluded area, as calculated by DNRP. In the event the County Assessor’s official parcel size is revised, the PBRS acreage shall be administratively adjusted to reflect that change.)
6. Except as modified herein, the facts set forth in DNRP’s preliminary report and testimony at the April 23, 2020, public hearing are correct and incorporated herein by reference. Copies of this report and DNRP’s report will be provided to the Metropolitan King County Council for final approval.
7. Contingent approval of 23 points and a current use valuation of 20% of assessed value for 4.00 acres of the property are consistent with KCC Chapter 20.36 and with the purposes and intent of King County to maintain, preserve, conserve, and otherwise continue in existence adequate open space lands and to assure the use and enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic and social well-being of King County and its citizens.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. APPROVE a current use valuation of 20% of assessed value for the 4.00-acre enrolled portion of the property, CONTINGENT on DNRP approving, by **December 31, 2020**, a forest stewardship plan addressing vegetation control, removal, and replanting.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

A person appeals an Examiner recommendation by following the steps described in KCC 20.22.230, including filing with the Clerk of the Council a sufficient appeal statement and a \$250 appeal fee (check payable to the King County FBOD). Appeal statements may refer only to facts contained in the hearing record; new facts may not be presented on appeal. KCC 20.22.230 also requires that the appellant provide copies of the appeal statement to the Examiner and to any named parties listed on the front page of the Examiner’s recommendation.

Prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on *June 1, 2020*, an electronic copy of the appeal statement must be sent to Clerk.Council@kingcounty.gov and a paper copy of the appeal statement and the \$250 appeal fee must be mailed to King County Council Clerk at 516 3rd Ave, Room 1200, Seattle, WA 98104, by first-class USPS mail, postage prepaid, postmarked June 1 or earlier. For tracking purposes, you may want to consider using USPS “Priority Service,” which will allow you to track delivery. Due to the Governor’s 20-25 proclamation, “Stay Home – Stay Healthy,” the King County Council Clerk is no longer accepting in-person delivery of appeals.

Unless both a timely and sufficient appeal statement and filing fee are filed by *June 1, 2020*, the Clerk of the Council shall place on the agenda of the next available Council meeting a proposed ordinance implementing the Examiner’s recommended action. At that meeting the Council may adopt the Examiner’s recommendation, defer action, refer the matter to a Council committee, or remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

If a timely and sufficient appeal statement and filing fee are filed by *June 1, 2020*, the Examiner will notify all parties and interested persons and provide information about “next steps.”
