1 CONTACT YOUR INSURANCE PROVIDER



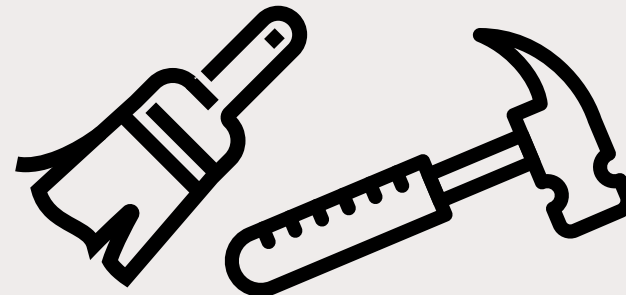
Filing a claim with your insurance provider for home, auto, renters, or commercial insurance is your first step in disaster recovery. You should be prepared to provide policy documents and photos of your property damage.

3 CLEANING UP AND REBUILDING



Rebuilding after a disaster can be a long and complicated process. Keep receipts for repairs, replacements, and any disaster-related costs. These costs may be eligible for reimbursement by your insurance provider or government assistance programs. Avoid scams! Verify contractors are licensed through Washington State Labor & Industries.

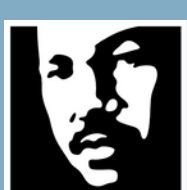
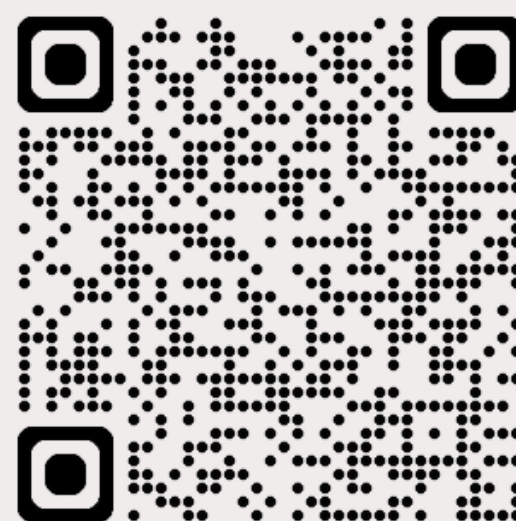

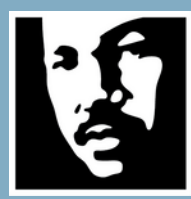
King County Emergency Management is evaluating impacts from the recent flooding. Please submit an impact survey if you experienced impacts to private property or businesses.
